MISSION OUTREACH

Blood Drive on April 29: Our next blood drive is Saturday, April 29, in Plymouth Hall, from 10 AM – 2:30 PM.

If you are eligible and would like to be a donor, please join us at this blood drive or attend one of the other local events by making an appointment online at donors.vitalant.org/dwp/portal/dwa or by calling 877-258-4825. GleanSLO needs a volunteer to glean at the Templeton Farmers Market, at 6th and Crocker streets, on Saturday mornings. This volunteer would collect leftover and other donated produce at the Templeton Farmers Market and deliver it to the Atascadero Loaves & Fishes food pantry. The Warming Center for the Homeless was approved to use Plymouth Hall for overnights on Wednesdays and Thursdays when the winter weather is very cold and/or raining. The Paso Robles Church of the Nazarene hosts the warming center on Mondays and Tuesdays, while other churches may make their halls available for the other three nights of the week. The warming center is conducted by a collaborative of three nonprofits – Hope and Faith Street Outreach, Paso Cares Homeless Services, and LAGS Recovery Center. Guests are provided a hot dinner and cots on which to sleep. Those with pets can keep them in provided kennels. A pair of chaperones supervises the first half of the evening, while another pair of chaperones supervises the second half. Volunteers are needed to serve as food providers or chaperones. Those desiring to volunteer at the warming center are asked to call Pastor Stephen Anastasia of the Nazarene Church at 805-242-2675.

Our Plymouth Cares meal on March 7th served only 72 meals probably due to up to 20 guests eating at the Warming Center hosted that night at the Nazarene Church. The guests enjoyed a hearty dinner of pulled pork with corn and scalloped potatoes prepared by Stu. The savory sides were Evelyn's crisp green salad with Ranch dressing; buttered Hawaiian sweet rolls by a round-table crew of John & Linda T., Olivia, Ronny and Chris; Alison's famous Scottish shortbread; and refreshing bottled waters from Alex. The PBJ sack lunches were created by the assembly-line of Chris, Sharon W., John B., Olivia, Ronny, Linda, and Carlie & John S. Our joyful servers at the ECHO Paso shelter were Stu, Chris, John T., Pearl and John S. It was another afternoon of happy fellowship while following the guidance of Jesus to help those in need. Our next Plymouth Cares meal is April 4th and helpers are always appreciated.

The One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) special mission offering was taken on March 19. An update on the amount collected will be available in next month's Beacon. OGHS is the annual UCC offering that sends support to relieve suffering locally and around the globe.

The "Donations for Homeless" box in Plymouth Hall is receiving wonderful items. A list of accepted donations to the ECHO Paso Robles homeless shelter is attached to the box. These items include cases of bottled water, shirts, pants, shoes, blankets, towels, hygiene items, art supplies, and new socks. Members of our Mission-Outreach Team will deliver the donated items to the shelter. Please check out the list and donate those unneeded items and perhaps a case of bottled water and some new socks.

PCC Members have channeled many dollars to Loaves and Fishes to buy food for people who really need it.


