I just posted the following to my local Facebook "Buy Nothing" (BN) group:

BIG ASK: I have an amazing friend who moves into an actual house after a year-and-a-half of being homeless, and she has next to nothing. Her husband told her early last year that he was leaving her, and had already given their landlord 30 days notice, leaving her with literally nowhere to go. This, after she supported him and their family through years of his unemployment and the pandemic by working full-time, and then draining the retirement she'd been building for almost 20 years so he could go to trade school, and just so they could survive. For months after this she spent half the week living in her car, and the other half of the week in motels so she could maintain joint custody of their fiveyear-old son. It also meant giving up living with her two teen sons, who now had to be with their dad full-time. She's spent the last nine months in a friend's spare room, but finally once again has a place of her own. This Thursday she moves into a two-bedroom house with little more than a queen mattress, a few blankets, a few pots and pans, very basic toiletries, and the clothes she has for her and her youngest son (now six). She needs just about everything, but please no junk. This is a 40year-old woman who until recently had things she loved (and worked so hard for), and safe space, and could not imagine being in this type of situation. Think of the things you would need and would like to have if you were in her situation, and please reach out with any questions. This community has shown up in so many incredible ways. Thank you for being a safe space to make a request like this.

Sastor Wendy

In theory, the Buy Nothing group is meant to eliminate waste, keep people from buying when there's something available to share, request a needed item, and pass on lovely or useful things we no longer need.

In my community it's become much more than that.

I've seen this space provide for multiple people in circumstances like that of my friend. I've seen us rally to support kids who are being bullied with play dates, and gift cards, and words of encouragement. I've seen hurt and broken people post about being impacted by ignorance and discrimination right in our midst, to have a hundred people remind them they are loved and seen, and to show up in tangible ways.

All of this requires effort. We think of social media as being effortless, but used for its best purposes it requires practical and emotional vulnerability and sacrifice . . . In sharing about our struggles. In responding to things that feel painful and overwhelming when we're already overwhelmed. In arranging pick-up or drop-off when it would be so much easier to drop our stuff in the Good Will bin. And in digging through our storage for a needed item that's literal treasure to someone else, but that we will likely never use again.

This clearly isn't only about social media. It's about seeing each other in our needs, our struggles, and our celebrations. It's about reminding people that they genuinely matter.





