



The Box for Donations for the Unhoused that was delivered to the ECHO Paso shelter for July consisted of a large portion of the huge assortment of clothes received in May, which included a purse, a lady's sweater and a baggy of craft jewelry. We are thankful for these wonderful contributions.

This year's Strengthen the Church special mission offering was initiated on June 8. The amount received was \$420. This UCC offering supports youth ministries and full-time leaders for new UCC churches in parts of the country where the UCC does not have a strong presence, as well as supporting new initiatives at existing UCC churches. We are thankful to those who were able to contribute to this offering.

The SLO Food Bank is selected to receive our monetary donations to support a food pantry ministry to the hungry in SLO County. We believe the Food Bank is the best local ministry/organization that is aligned with Plymouth Church's commitment to grace and inclusion, as stated in the Food Bank's website at slofoodbank.org:

- Every human being has the right to nutritious food, regardless of the reasons that they may not be able to obtain it for themselves.
- The SLO Food Bank's intent is not only to help make nutritious food available through programs and agencies, but also to encourage and support each person served, recognizing their possible vulnerabilities and sensitivities.
- Everyone the SLO Food Bank serves, whether individuals, families or agencies, deserve to be treated with kindness, respect, and dignity.

Offerings to the Food Bank can be done via our offering envelopes when marked for "Food Bank;" checks should be made payable to Plymouth Church with a notation for "Food Bank." Accordingly, donations to Loaves & Fishes will no longer be processed through Plymouth Church. We received a thank-you letter from Kizito Munguci, one of our two Zozu Project boys whose education we sponsor in Uganda. Kizito shares his appreciation for our providing a gift for his 11th birthday. Kizito turned 11 years old on June 15 and was sent a gift of \$100. Half of Kizito's gift money is used to buy presents for himself and items needed for his family, while the other half will be placed in a family savings account for emergencies. Kizito's letter can be seen on the Outreach bulletin board in Fellowship Hall. Thank you for those who could donate to this Zozu gift fund that is used for birthdays and for Christmas.

Saturday, July 19, was our third quarterly blood drive for 2025. The number of donations received was 32, which was well above the donation target. Our spacious Fellowship Hall was a scene of tranquil service with the floor cleared for the Vitalant team's equipment and donors providing the gift of life, while others waited to be called. As usual, St. James Church provided wonderful greeters who checked in the donors and directed them to snacks and water as they awaited their turn. We appreciate the availability of our hall to provide this valuable service in which each donation is used for medical emergencies or routine medical care and has the potential to save up to three lives each.

The Board of the Mission-Outreach Team is again down to four voting members, with the passing of our beloved Pearl Munak. We would dearly like our number to be at least five voting members, which would provide one more person's ideas and energy for our various ministries, and to make us an official board according to our church constitution. If our activities and purpose tugs on your heart, please consider joining us. Those interested can learn more about us at our monthly meetings on the third Sunday, in the Library after the service.
