### Pastor's Letter ~ December 2023 Reverend Wendy Holland



Our Thursday morning Bible study is currently in the book of Acts, and this week we looked at chapter 3, where Peter and John encounter the man who has been unable to walk since birth. He shows up at the Temple gate each day, delivered faithfully by people who care enough to get him situated so he can beg for money.

When Peter and John pass by he calls out to them, desperate for any small contribution. Peter approaches and says, "Look at us." We had a great time discussing the implications of those three words: the invitation to human connection, the reality that Peter and John likely presented as financially needy themselves, and the impact it has when we *genuinely see* each other.

But the most profound thing happening here is that this man was asking only for the bare minimum, hoping for nothing more than to scrape by each day. Calling out to God for healing isn't even on his radar. But God has been paying attention to him all along. Peter tells him - in the name of Jesus - to stand up and walk, and the man is healed and transformed.

The Advent season is a reminder that God *sees* us. When the Hebrew people were waiting for the Messiah, in good times and in bad, they *called out* to God - in expectation, in frustration, with joy - but always trusting that God would keep that promise of provision and deliverance.

Because of Jesus, we share in that same anticipation of God's goodness in our lives. We can be fully expectant of provision and deliverance. We can call out to God boldly, excited for what comes next.

Like we did in November, we will be holding youth rehearsals for our Christmas Eve service every Sunday after service for about 30 minutes. We will be rehearsing December 3rd, 10th, and 17th this month. All of our church youth who are interested in participating are welcome and encouraged to join us in whatever capacity works best for them.

Our Youth Group members have been invited to help the **Plymouth Cares program serve our holiday meal for the people who** are unhoused in our community on <u>Tuesday, December 5th.</u> We will be meeting at the Paso ECHO shelter from 4:45-6PM to serve, so please join us if you can and help to spread some holiday cheer!

Our Youth Bible study and band will be happening this month, with some schedule changes to accommodate our special Christmas-time events. Youth Group (6th grade and up) are invited to join us at 6:30PM at the Youth House for band rehearsal, followed by Bible study from 7-8:30PM, on <u>Wednesday December 6th</u> and <u>December 20th</u>.

Bring your favorite holiday potluck dish and join us in the Fellowship Hall from 5:30-8:30PM for a night of crafting Christmas ornaments, playing games, fellowship with our church friends, and singing Christmas carols. Everyone in our Plymouth family is welcome to attend, so we hope to see you there! ### PRUNING ~ PART 2 ~ Chris Macy



In the month of October, I shared a little piece on pruning, using **why** we prune our plants and trees as a metaphor for spiritual pruning in The Beacon. Well, watch out what you write! Less than a week went by when those big shears from the sky headed my way. And not just little maintenance snips here and there. Wow! I was in for the big prune – the "you don't look like you used to" kind of pruning, which, **SPOILER ALERT**, is the ultimate point of pruning, spiritual or otherwise.

And boy, did I have my arsenal of responses at the ready, even though I know better. Grumbling, murmuring, complaining, moaning and groaning, feeling put out and put upon, like maybe I had a big X on my back, pissed off, and just a general attitude of Why me?; an underlying out-rage of What? Again?; Give me a break, why don'tcha?

A wise pastor once told his congregation not to ask God, "Why me?", but that the better question was to ask God, "What are you doing with me?" Oh yeah... I momentarily forgot about that.
