## Reverend Wendy Holland ~ Pastor's Letter ~ February 2024

### Lent is coming.



My first exposure to Lent was through my Catholic grandmother. When she got married she stopped going to church (a whole other story), but when she returned later in life she embraced her religion, and Lent was one of the most visible practices of her faith. Not because she was overly pious or made a big deal out of it, but because it was just about her and God. At this time of year during our weekly visits we would get together and consume no See's, no Cadbury, no chocolate cake . . . And it's not as if she purged the house. It was still around, and she encouraged me to have whatever I wanted.

Giving up chocolate in itself doesn't feel like a big deal. But for someone who didn't drink, didn't socialize besides immediate family, and whose greatest joy beyond loved ones was TV shows about babies, and videos featuring Sarah Brightman and Andrea Bocelli, it was a sacrifice.

As someone who was previously unfamiliar with the practice, I watched and learned, and observed some interesting things about both her and myself.

For many of us, our grandparents' homes were - or are - places of indulgence. But during Lent, in giving up something she loved, I saw in my grandmother serenity without angst. She just lived in the season and found contentment in other areas. It was also the time where we had some of our deepest conversations about faith.

I myself found a willingness to honor her commitment to God and put her comfort before my own. And, it was another reminder of God's strength, and personal will power, and realizing that when we're willing to let go of something, God often replaces it with something more valuable.

I want to shift gears by saying that Lent is also the time to consider giving up a burden, or a fear. It's a time where we can let go of something that might have been right for a time but is no longer what God's call.

Be gracious to yourself. Think, pray, and meditate on what Lent might look like for you in this season. And anticipate God showing up.

## SERVING THOSE IN NEED ~ NEWS FOR FEBRUARY 2024 ~ By John Svinth

Our Plymouth Cares meal on January 2nd served guests at the ECHO Paso shelter with 92 dinners and all 75 PBJ sack lunches that were prepared by 17 wonderful participants. Shepherd's pie was the delicious main dish organized by Melinda and prepared by her, Gail and Ronny. A crisp green salad with Ranch dressing was prepared and delivered by Becky and Alex. Tasty buttered Hawaiian sweet rolls were provided by Linda and John T. The always popular Scottish shortbread returned as the dessert by Alison. The sack lunch crew was Cole and Dylan; Dawn and granddaughters Ruby and Opal; and Olivia, Sally, Carlie and John S. Our serving crew was Melinda, John T., Carlie and John S. Please join us if you are available for part of an afternoon, where you will be a blessing to those in need and be blessed in return, and enjoy wonderful fellowship. The Plymouth Cares meals are always the first Tuesdays of each month, so the next is February 6th. Helpers are always needed and appreciated.

A Prayer Box is being used at Plymouth Cares meals to collect requests from guests that are sent to our church prayer group. A sandwich-board sign invites guests to fill out a request slip and insert it into the prayer box. This ministry was the idea of Pastor Wendy and provides another avenue for Plymouth Church to connect with and serve those in need. The prayer box is available to be used at other church activities.

The UCC Christmas Fund Offering received wonderful donations amounting to \$360. This holiday blessing helped make Christmas time and its aftermath merrier for active and retired UCC clergy, lay employees, and their surviving spouses experiencing financial need. The spirit of Christmas is eternal.

The Heifer Project "Living Gift Market" collected an incredible \$6,730 that was sent to provide selected agricultural resources to help struggling farmers become successful and pay it forward. The Heifer Project pursues an end to world hunger and poverty by providing struggling farmers with training, resources and marketing support, after which they will pass on their training and resources to the next generation. This year's donations went to providing a gift arc, clean water, goats, sheep, garden seeds, flocks of chicks, sending a girl to school, a hope basket of rabbits and chicks, and additional money to go where the Heifer Project deems it most needed. I learned that, in addition to Terry Reid, her husband, Don, who preceded her passing, were both big supporters of the Heifer Project, so I'm sure they both would be pleased.

The Box for Donations for the Unhoused in Plymouth's Fellowship Hall continues to collect a variety of gifts to comfort those needing protection from the elements. Recent donations included sweaters, shirts, shoes, quilts and a wide selection of toiletries. Our youth group used many of the items for Care Kits they distributed to guests at our warming shelter events, with other items made directly available to the warming shelter program, and remaining items welcomed by the ECHO Paso Robles Shelter.

The Blood Drive on January 20th collected 21 lifesaving donations. This quarterly outreach activity with St. James Church again saw the Plymouth Fellowship Hall as the scene of critical donations of blood as Vitalant staff collected this precious gift that saves lives. Blood donations are in dire need after the COVID pandemic where one donation can save up to three lives, including children and adults who experience traumatic injuries and those undergoing medical procedures. Our next blood drive is Saturday, April 27th and appointments can be scheduled up to two months prior using information on the next Vitalant flyer.
