Pastor's Letter ~ January 2024 Reverend Wendy Holland



Two of my favorite online videos feature - surprisingly - Westboro Baptist Church (WBC). If you're not familiar, Westboro Baptist gained widespread notoriety around the early 90s, most notably spreading messages of hate, protesting at funerals and in other public spaces, and insisting that anyone not aligned with their very narrow definition of righteousness will forever incur God's wrath.

I have a lot of thoughts about their tactics, and their theology, and whether we can even define them as a church from a New Testament perspective (spoiler: we can't), but today I want to talk about people who went out of their way to connect with their members.

The first video opens with a group of WBC members on the side of a highway, holding up protest signs for passers-by. Suddenly a flatbed truck carrying the band the Foo Fighters comes around the bend and we hear the fully-amplified opening notes of the Bee-Gees "You Should Be Dancing." The flatbed stops directly in front of the protestors, and we hear Dave Grohl say, "I love you. I love everybody . . . Isn't that what you're supposed to do? Can't we just love *everybody*?" In the foreground we see a woman - holding signs that say "God is Your Enemy" and "God Hates Pride" - begin moving to the music, while her signs lower.

The second video features Russell Brand interviewing two of WBC's leaders on his talk show. He introduces them by saying, "Please welcome my guests, *with love*..." When his audience begins to boo, he says, "Don't be mean, don't be mean!" Brand goes on to ask the two men about their views, talk about the love of Jesus and his own understanding of what that looks like, and - while vehemently disagreeing with their stance - continues to express love for them as humans. While they never entirely soften, you see them visibly relax and open up when they realize that Brand is genuine in his love and concern.

Both videos have obvious entertainment factor. But they're also an example of connecting on a human level. It's easy to criticize with those with whom we disagree. We can engage in us-versus-them - making valid and necessary points - without ever meeting face to face, or finding some common denominator . . . but it's unlikely to make a difference.

We have the best chance of affecting real change when we acknowledge each other's humanity, look for common ground, *and build relationship*.
