Pastor's Letter ~ July 2023 Reverend Wendy Holland

A friend of mine (we'll call her Liz) recently posted a picture on Facebook showing a plush and gorgeous very light-colored couch—with a glaring black sharpie mark in the center of one of the cushions. And the caption read, "We have lived here less than 5 days & there is absolutely no eating in the living room but they have already done this! I am so angry right now. They are 7 & 8 yrs. old; that's old enough to not do stuff like this, right?"

Before I go further, let me share a little bit about Liz. She's one of those people who has tons of online followers, not because she gravitates towards sensationalized posts, but because she is an *encourager*. She knows her value but is never braggy, instead using her accomplishments to remind others of their own potential. She always has a kind word, and never comes off as arrogant. And for all of Liz's humility and transparency, she always seems to have it together—which made this post all the more surprising.

But in retrospect, it wasn't <u>that</u> surprising. Before responding in anger to her kids, Liz turned to community for help. And it wasn't long before the comment-section filled up. Many responses were from parents of older kids, encouraging grace, and regretting some of our own harsh responses. Others made recommendations for stain removers. But no one attacked her for her transparency. They were much more motivated to extend the same love and grace Liz has modeled countless times, and to provide wise counsel.

And just a short time later Liz shared how this led not to an angry exchange with her kids, but in conversation, and real awareness on both sides, and hugs.

When we are aware of how we come across, and are focused on making the world better not just for ourselves, but providing an example to others, people take notice. And it makes them better people in response, who perpetuate that same goodness.

May we be aware, and may we always seek to perpetuate goodness.

On Tuesday, July 4th, our church youth have been invited to join Plymouth Cares to serve meals at the ECHO shelter in Paso. I will be there to help coordinate youth; we will be serving meals from 5-6PM at the ECHO location by the Paso fairgrounds. Please let me know if your youth would like to participate!

Our monthly Youth to Yogurt will be the 3rd Sunday of the month, July 16th. Our Plymouth Youth Group (6th grade and up) are invited to join me after church as we walk to downtown Paso Park for a frozen treat. We then spend some time in the park discussing upcoming events; it's a great way for our church youth to have their voices heard and to have a say in planning our youth programming.

Friday the 21st will be our monthly Date Night! Youth of all ages are invited to join me at Plymouth's Youth House from 5:30-8:30PM for a night of games, crafts, snacks, and fun with friends. Youth are welcome to bring friends as well!

Parents, we are looking for parent volunteers to help on Date Nights, whether that's volunteering your time during the 3-hour event or helping provide food for the kids. It's been difficult to coordinate volunteers the past few months, so please let me know if this is something you're interested in! Date Night will be followed by an overnight for our Youth Group, 6th grade and up. We will be staying overnight at the church for a night of lots of snacks, lots of games, and lots of fun. This is a time where our Youth Group, 6th grade and up, are invited to join myself and Pastor Wendy for an evening of conversations over pizza. The Strengthen the Church – Strengthen Our Church special mission offering collected \$745 through the end of May, with donations continuing to be accepted through June. This offering supports UCC leadership development, new churches, youth ministry, and innovation in existing congregations to promote their stability. One-half this year's offering will support Plymouth Church to help defray significant projected facilities expenses in the coming years.

Our Plymouth Cares meal on June 6th provided 75 servings at the ECHO Paso shelter. The entrée was the delicious reappearance of Aunt Eleanor's Beef Noodle Casserole by Stu and JoAnne, along with buttered Hawaiian rolls by John & Linda T., Pearl's green salad with Ranch dressing, Alison's Scottish Short Bread (Extras were requested by guests and staff.), and PBJ sack lunches assembled by John B., Melinda, Chris and John & Carlie S. The shelter now provides drinking water and so no longer requests bottled waters. Stu, JoAnne, Chris and John S. were our servers on that damp and cool afternoon. We reduced the amount of provided food according to ECHO's prediction for fewer guests, so our preparation worked well. Our next Plymouth Cares meal is July 4th, with helpers always appreciated and always needed. We look forward to PCC youth again helping to serve at the shelter.

Our next blood drive is Saturday, July 15, in Plymouth Hall, from 10 AM – 2:30 PM. If you are eligible and would like to be a donor, please join us or attend one of the other local blood drives by making an appointment online at donors.vitalant.org/dwp/portal/dwa or by calling 877-258-4825. A flyer is at the back of the sanctuary or on the Outreach bulletin board that provides a QR code that can also be scanned to make an appointment. Pridefest's "Pride in the Plaza" 2023 was the afternoon of Sunday, June 4th, at the SLO Mission Plaza. It was a wonderful celebration of LGBTQ+ to support and empower people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and expressions and to strengthen and unite our Central Coast Community. Plymouth Church was well represented at the UCC booth where we served alongside members of the Community Church of Atascadero and the San Luis Obispo UCC.

The gift money for Kizito Munguci's 9th birthday saw \$142 and a birthday letter sent to help celebrate his special day as one of our two boys we sponsor in Uganda via the Zozu Project. A Zozu staff person will help Kizito use some of this money to purchase gifts, while the remainder will be set aside for future support of his family. Per the guidance of the Zozu Project, we send gift donations for our boys on birthdays and at Christmas. The US dollar goes a long way in Uganda, so this is a wonderful present for Kizito.

The "Donations for Homeless" box was filled to overflowing with a wonderful assortment that included a blanket, toiletries, shoes, shirts, pants, sweaters, towels and a backpack. The ECHO shelter was thrilled to receive these items. A list of acceptable donations is attached to the box in Plymouth Hall, for which we ask for continued items on the list among unwanted possessions at home or perhaps that you might purchase to donate. Thank you for helping the unsheltered.

In the sanctuary pews you will find cards to put in the collection plate if you would like some help or prayers. The praying chain is private and your concerns will be kept confidential.




