24 "Anyone who listens to my teaching and follows it is wise, like a person who builds a house on solid rock. 25 Though the rain comes in torrents and the floodwaters rise and the winds beat against that house, it won't collapse because it is built on bedrock. ~ Matthew 7:24-25 (NLT) ~ A couple of weeks back I was in a car accident. I was at a notorious Arroyo Grande intersection, known well to locals, and a confusing mess to anyone not familiar with the two right turn lanes—one leading to the strip malls up the hill, and one leading to the 101 North. It's one of those driving situations that causes serious white-knuckles and instigates terse (at best) instructions from parents of new drivers. Take it from me [insert rolling eyes emoji].

And unless you know how it works, you're almost guaranteed to end up in the wrong lane—and unaware that switching lanes can be a hazard to everyone around you. This is what happened to the guy who hit my car. But what made matters worse is that the road had been recently resurfaced, and there were no lines or reflectors anywhere on the block leading up to these problematic turn-lanes.

Life can be complicated even when we know what we're doing and where we're going; even when we define potential obstacles and hazards. I saw this guy a block back, knew he was in the wrong lane, and identified that he probably wasn't sure how it worked to access the freeway. I passed him and thought I was out of harm's way . . . and was still hit.

The aftermath was much more encouraging. A witness followed us to a nearby parking lot. The guy who hit me was shaken up, but took full responsibility. And I was able to not take personally that he made a mistake. And the people I dealt with every step of the way facilitated making something extremely inconvenient a reminder that the world is filled with good people, doing their best to make the world a better place.

In Matthew 7:24-27 Jesus compares following his instructions to building on a stable foundation. We follow Christ not because we will be shielded from detriment, but so that when storms do come we are able to withstand them in a way that honors God—and hopefully blesses others in the process. May we be strengthened for beautiful weather, ferocious storms, and everything in between.


This is a night of youth-led conversations over pizza, where we discuss the topics our church youth most want to talk about. We hope to see you there!


