Pastor's Letter ~ June 2023

When my kids were small, the compliment I received most frequently was how genuinely courteous and engaged they were: That they had firm handshakes, looked people in the eye when communicating, and always used "please" and "thank you" with utmost sincerity.

As any parent or caregiver is aware, outside communication doesn't always reflect the interactions we're having at home. But it does demonstrate core values—the ones we're learning, and the ones we're carrying into the real world.

I was recently thinking about how I often communicate in the language of gratitude, and that this was modeled for me. I let people know they are having an impact on me by thanking them for their work and their presence. I sign off with gratitude in correspondence.

However, it's not just about going through the motions of being polite and saying, "thank you." It's about acknowledging that it is not always easy to do the work; it's about acknowledging and appreciating sacrifice ~ which then ironically makes it a little bit easier to live sacrificially.

Oftentimes our expressed gratitude doesn't come close to the sacrifice being made, which brings us to the Plymouth Estate Sale. One person had a vision, others jumped onboard, and it was a reminder of what we have the power to accomplish.

So, *thank you*, not only to the people who made the Estate Sale happen, but to *all* who contributed. Thank you to the people who make this church amazing. Thank you for the privilege of pastoring, and leading, and serving alongside you; of getting to see you in your most real moments and allowing me to be real.

Thank you for being a community that is compassionate and accessible, and for making it safe for others to be authentic. Thank you for walking the talk.

Doing church (and life) ethically and sacrificially is not the easiest, but it is the most impacting. Let's keep brainstorming, and talking, and doing the work. It's not easy to be and do, all the things that Jesus calls us to ~ that doing church *ethically* calls us too. But I'm here for all the conversations. Please don't hesitate to reach out.

The way forward is love.
The way to open doors is love.
The way to social change is love.
The way to peace is love.
The way to equality is love.
Let go of the anger and fear
and let love show you the way.

Strengthen the Church – Strengthen Our Church” special mission offering, began May 28: The Strengthen the Church special mission offering is taken each year by churches in the United Church of Christ, which we began on Pentecost Sunday, May 28th. The “Strengthen the Church” offering supports leadership development, new churches, youth ministry, and innovation in existing congregations to promote their stability. As done previously, Plymouth Church will keep half of this year’s offering to support the growth and stability of our church thereby making this offering “Strengthen the Church – Strengthen Our Church.” Our current need is to help defray significant projected facilities expenses in the coming years. Please plan to give, as you are able, to support UCC churches and the growth and stability of Plymouth Church. Donations may be by check payable to Plymouth Church with a notation for “STC” or by using the Strengthen the Church offering envelopes.

Our Blood Drive on April 29th collected 21 donations! Plymouth Hall was again the scene of lifesaving giving as Vitalant staff collected this precious gift that saves lives. Blood donations are in critical need and one donation can save up to three lives, including children and adults who experience traumatic injuries and those needing blood for ongoing medical procedures. Our blood drives occur quarterly and are in partnership with St. James Church. If you are able and willing, please participate in these life-giving activities. **Our next blood drive is scheduled for Saturday, July 15th.**

Our Plymouth Cares meal on May 2nd served 97 meals. Yes, ninety-seven! We were fortunate to have plenty of Stu’s “hearty hamburger soup,” buttered rolls by John T., Pearl’s green salad with Ranch dressing, chocolate-chip cookies by Alison, bottled waters from Alex, and PBJ sack lunches. Wonderful helpers prepared the meal on time while sharing their delightful company that made the time productive and fun: Alex, Becky, Linda, John B. Carlie, Jim & Charity. **Our next Plymouth Cares meal is June 6th,** for which helpers are always appreciated and always needed.

Help feed the hungry with GleanSLO door hangers: If you observe a residence that is growing produce, you can help them feed the hungry in the North County by getting a GleanSLO door hanger from the back of the church sanctuary and placing on the grower’s door. The GleanSLO door hanger politely informs the grower how to get unused produce gleaned and delivered to feed the hungry.

The “Donations for Homeless” box continues to receive wonderful items that are delivered to the ECHO Paso shelter. A list of acceptable donations is attached to the box in Plymouth Hall. Should you find items on the list that are at home and no longer needed, or perhaps that you might purchase to donate, please place them in the box so that they may benefit the unsheltered.

The One Great Hour of Sharing special mission offering, which was taken from March 19 through early February, collected \$1,418 that the UCC will use to provide relief to crises occurring locally and around the world. The importance of this offering seems never more evident, and we are so very thankful for our congregation’s expression of support that makes real this year’s OGHs theme: *It’s Time to Share*.

Pridefest “Pride in the Plaza” 2023 is Sunday, June 4th, from 1:30 – 5:30 PM, at the SLO Mission Plaza. This is a free celebration of LGBTQ+ and a fundraiser to support and empower people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and expressions to strengthen and unite our Central Coast Community. Attendees will enjoy live entertainment, food, family activities, and many booths offering wares, support resources and information to promote inclusivity. 

In case you were wondering what the Diaconate Board does, here are many of the jobs we take care of.


- † We prepare the elements for communion.
