Pastor's Letter ~ March 2024

There's an interesting exchange in Luke 9:49-55 that reads:

⁴⁹ John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone using your name to cast out demons, but we told him to stop because he isn't in our group."

⁵⁰ But Jesus said, "Don't stop him! Anyone who is not against you is for you."

⁵¹ As the time drew near for him to ascend to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for his Jerusalem. ⁵² He sent messengers ahead to a Samaritan village to prepare for his

arrival. ⁵³ But the people of the village did not welcome Jesus because he was on his way to Jerusalem. ⁵⁴ When James and John saw this, they said to Jesus, "Lord, should we call down fire from heaven to burn them up?" ⁵⁵ But Jesus turned and rebuked them.

We sometimes hear about Jesus's earliest followers and laugh at how unsophisticated they were, or shake our heads at their ignorance. Here the Disciples are just beginning to recognize the power and influence they have as followers of Christ. Not that they were walking in obedience for their own gain. Everyone was making sacrifices. But the perks would be undeniable.

They can actually make a difference in people's lives! And of course, this would in turn benefit *them*. The Disciples would be seen as special, desirable, the cool people to have at a party.

So when they hear that other people who aren't even part of their circle are using the name of Jesus to do good works—and later when they're not received with the celebration and favor they've become accustomed to—they are instantly suspicious. They forget everything Jesus has taught them about grace and inclusion, and are instead ready to divide and conquer.

But Jesus reminds them that everyone else's good works don't have to look like *their* good works, and vice versa. And that wherever people reflect the goodness of God and the Gospel we can find common ground.

There are things happening in the world that absolutely call for critique, and even condemnation. But before we pass judgment based on "outsider" status let's prayerfully, discerningly take a look at their priorities and accomplishments.

When we let go of judgment and ego and fear, we can find Jesus in some unexpected and beautiful spaces.

May the Spirit be our continual guide and constant companion.


