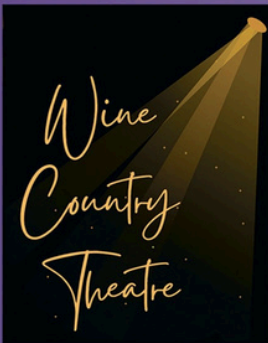

Luke 15 reminds us that Jesus didn't just welcome the outsider—he went looking for them. The shepherd rejoices over the lost sheep, the woman celebrates finding her lost coin, the dad welcomes back the imperfect son. Their joy wasn't just in recovering what was missing, but in making whole what was incomplete.

It can be uncomfortable to stretch ourselves, especially when we have so many ideas about what it means to lead and serve our church. But true belonging is about including those who have felt excluded. And we never look more like Jesus than when we welcome others into the love we ourselves have received.

From our *31 Days of Prayer* study, may this be the cry of our hearts: "*Lord, cause people to come to love you with all their heart, soul, mind, and strength; and to come to love their neighbor as themselves.*"

With deep gratitude for the work God continues to do in and through us,

As we've stepped into the new year I'm incredibly encouraged by our unified focus on connection, outreach, and the spirit of inclusion. Over the past few weeks our leadership has been prayerfully considering how we can continue to open our doors—not just to events, but to people looking for a place to belong.

From the beautiful reflections of our loving-kindness meditation this past week; Wine Country Theater's upcoming production of *Tiny Beautiful Things*; our annual Talent Show and Estate Sale in May; and musical performances on the horizon—each event provides the opportunity to share our space, build relationships, and extend the radical hospitality that defines our church.

I've heard over and over that “these events allow us to show people the kind of church we are . . .” Meaning one that provides a safe space and a warm welcome to those who might otherwise feel out of place in Christian community.

Hello Plymouth families, and happy March! I hope everyone is having a good start to your month and looking forward to our upcoming events. As with last month, our youth are again invited to help out with our Plymouth Cares meal serving! The first Tuesday of the month, March 4th, is when John Svinth coordinates our Plymouth Cares meal preparation and serving for our homeless community members. Meals will be prepped during the time most of our youth are in school, but any who are able to help out are invited to join us at the ECHO shelter in Paso at 4:45PM to help set up, and we will be serving meals from 5-6PM. Please join us if you can!

Our Youth Bible Study will be on the 2nd Wednesday of the month, 3/12, at the Youth House from 6:30-8PM! Youth Group (6th grade and up) are invited to our Bible study led by Trago Wallace, to come talk about different scripture and Bible passages and discuss them with peers. Youth are welcome to invite friends, and there will also be pizza! If you have any questions or would like to RSVP, please reach out to me or Trago Wallace. We hope to see you there!

Our monthly Youth to Yogurt will be the 3rd Sunday of the month, 3/16. Youth Group 6th grade and up are invited to join me after service to walk to the downtown Paso park for a frozen treat. We will spend some time discussing upcoming youth events and plans, and it's a great way for our youth to be involved in the planning process and to get their input heard.
