Let's root ourselves in Christ, in each other, and in the deep well of hope that comes from knowing we are part of something bigger.

Dear Plymouth Family,

There's an undeniable heaviness in the air these days. So many of us are feeling overwhelmed by the cruelty, division, and fear that are seeping into public life. The rise in hate-fueled rhetoric, increasing attacks on things like "compassion" and "empathy," and the exclusion and marginalization of the most vulnerable—these aren't simply political issues. They're deeply spiritual ones, that Jesus addressed in his own time boldly and without hesitation.

As people who follow Jesus—the one who welcomed outsiders, challenged the powerful, and healed the broken-hearted—we're called not to look away, but to lean in. Not with despair, but with courage. And not alone, but together.

Our calling is to promote and instill hope. Not shallow optimism, but real hope—hope that is grounded in community, in justice, and in the love of Christ that transcends boundaries.

This is one of the reasons I'm so grateful for our wider UCC community. After some years of being more detached from our denomination, this is a vital moment for us to reconnect. The United Church of Christ—especially our own Southern California Nevada Conference—is offering powerful resources and spaces to ground us spiritually and equip us practically.

**The Box for Donations for the Unhoused** yielded a wonderful assortment of bath towels and a lovely shirt. These were delivered to the ECHO shelter on April 1st where they were appreciatively received by the shelter residents.

**Saturday, April 12, was our second quarterly blood drive for 2025.** This blood drive collected 19 donations that will be used for medical emergencies and ongoing medical care. One pint of donated blood can save up to three lives. Thank you to those who could donate.

**The One Great Hour Of Sharing (OGHS) special mission offering** which was initiated on March 30, received \$143 to help the UCC "Be the Light" to provide relief for domestic and international development, fight poverty and its consequences, bring aid and relief to communities torn by war or ravaged by national disaster, advocacy and resettlement assistance for refugees and displaced persons, and combat injustice in its many forms. We appreciate this support from our church to participate in this worldwide mission outreach.

**Alex and Becky responded to a request from ECHO** to provide a meal at the shelter on April 19, at date which was not previously reserved by a meal provider. They created and served 87 dinners of Hearty Hamburger Casserole, salad, rolls and brownies. The brownies we enjoyed at Easter Sunday's fellowship were perhaps extras from that meal. Thank you to Alex and Becky for providing an additional meal for ECHO.

# BIO: Dawn Stemper

I came to Paso Robles in the early 1960's at the age of 5. I am the last girl to have attended 1st grade at the Geneseo School which is now a part of Pioneer Museum. I grew up on an Angus cattle ranch half way between town and Creston. Raising cattle and learning to sew in 4-H rounded out my childhood years.

I went on to have a professional career as a home health and hospice nurse, played adult softball for 30 years and was a 4-H leader for 25 years. Currently retired and spend many hours quilting, working jigsaw puzzles and farming lavender. We have 8 grandchildren who are all local and we love attending all of their school and sports events.

Our family began attending church at the Methodist Church across the street from Plymouth. There were simultaneous clergy changes and my family chose Plymouth Congregational Church in the mid 1960's. I've been here ever since. My spiritual journey began by attending Sunday school and being an acolyte. I married Les Stemper, in this church in 1976. We had 3 children which were baptized here as well as our 1st grandson. My other church activities included being chairperson of Christian Education board along with being Sunday school teacher, member of Plymouth Circle, trustees, Church Council, bell choir and being church sexton for 8 years.

In 2007, Barbara Kossett, Isolde Lata and I began the Prayer Quilt Ministry here at Plymouth. We are Chapter # 630 of the Prayers and Squares International organization. We make quilts for people in the congregation and sometimes the community who are in physical, emotional or spiritual crisis and in need of Prayers through the gift of a quilt. These quilts are physical representations of the biblical principle of "love thy neighbor". Physical evidence of faith in God, in love, in prayer. There are three rules we follow when considering giving a quilt...1) The Ministry is about the prayers not the quilt. 2) Recipient must be asked and agree to accept the gift of prayer in the form of a quilt. We also ask what prayers are requested. 3) No money is accepted when a quilt is given. When the Quilts are selected, they are placed on the altar for 1-2 Sundays for the congregation to tie the knots while saying a prayer for the individual. When you tie a knot, you use your hands. This is symbolic of laying on of hands, a tradition of Christian healing. Resource for our ministry is from the book, "*Fabric of Faith*" by Kimberly Winston.

Anyone can make a request for a quilt on behalf of someone in need. If anyone would like to help with the ministry, let Barbara or myself know. Remember, it's about prayer, not quilts. Donations can be made to the Prayer Quilt Ministry fund at the office or offeratory envelope with specific notation.


