Pastor's Letter ~ November 2023 Reverend Wendy Holland

I've never been a huge fan of beauty pageants, both because I was raised to believe that one's focus should be on intellectual accomplishment and education and, maybe more importantly because I never felt like beauty queen material. (Have you noticed that it's easy for us to have contempt for the things that are beyond our reach?)

It wasn't until I was well into adulthood that I realized the pageant circuit can be a vehicle to scholarships, better education, bringing visibility to worthy causes, and accomplishing genuine good in the world.

Just this morning I heard about Mollie Moon, a Civil Rights Movement activist who hosted fundraising events in the 1940s, '50s, and '60s, including pageants celebrating the beauty of young Black women - women who would likely not feel like the beauty standard in their surrounding environments. Not only was Mollie telling these women they were worthy of being seen *and* heard, and building their confidence and ability to contribute in the process, but she was raising money for to advance causes of freedom and equality.

In sharing Mollie's story, historian Tanisha Ford made the point that too often we don't talk about how we fund the work and movements that change the world because "money sounds dirty when we talk about justice and freedom, and liberation and democracy; we don't think that those things should cost money."

When we think about doing the work of the Gospel - both as individuals and as a church - we can have that same attitude. But throughout the Bible, and throughout Jesus's ministry, we see people generously and unashamedly giving of their time, abilities, and finances to create a better world, and to share the hope we find in Jesus.

As we move into November, focusing on stewardship and our pledge drive to Plymouth's ministry for the year ahead, think about all the different ways Plymouth is serving the world around us. Some of them are surprising and unique, and look nothing like our own lives or context - but they are making a difference; bringing hope and confidence, and bringing spiritual connection and practical provision.

As always, we can only do the work we are funded and equipped for, so we ask that you prayerfully consider all the ways God is leading *you* to make a difference in the year ahead. Don't be afraid to see things in a new way.

We are so grateful for your commitment and contributions.

The Mission-Outreach Team seeks board members. We are operating with only four board members and would greatly benefit from more. If you are encouraged by our activities, or would like more information, please see John Svinth, Chris Macy, Pearl Munak or Stu Stoddard.

The Plymouth Cares meal ministry seeks an additional main course cook. We seek a cook to add to the rotation for the main course of our monthly meals for the homeless. If you have basic skills at the stove and can spare one afternoon every three or four months, then you could be the blessing we need. We have recipes (if needed), you will be reimbursed for the ingredients, and we will all get to enjoy the fellowship of the Plymouth Church kitchen. If interested, please talk to John Svinth, Chris Macy, Pearl Munak or Stu Stoddard.

The Neighbors in Need special mission offering was taken on October 1st. The amount received thus far is \$590! These and any additional donations will be sent to our regional UCC office to support its ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. Another way we are making a better world!

Our Plymouth Cares meal on October 3rd served 97 (ninety-seven!) dinners at the ECHO Paso shelter, including 75 sack lunches, which saw 18 participants contribute to this meal! The entrée was the popular Aunt Eleanor's Beef Noodle Casserole created by Stu, John T., Britt, and Sharon W. Pearl made the crisp green salad with tomato slices and Ranch dressing. John and Linda T. prepared the buttered Hawaiian Sweet Rolls. Meghan, Hazel and Argentina baked and bagged big M&M cookies for the dessert. The efficient sack lunch crew was Sharon W., Melinda, Ronny, John B., Chris, Carlie & John S., five-year-old Ari, and new helpers Nikol and Andrew. Linda and Ronny also emptied the dishwasher of its cleaned load from the previous Sunday's fellowship. Our servers at the ECHO Shelter were Stu, Pearl, Ronny, Carlie and John S., who received many a "thank you" from appreciative guests. Our next Plymouth Cares meal is the first Tuesday of next month, November 7th, where helpers are always needed and always appreciated.

The box of "Donations for Homeless" received more wonderful gifts that were happily accepted at the ECHO Paso shelter. The October donations included shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste, lotions, and over a dozen, all-day RTA bus passes. If you are interested in donating to the homeless, please see the list of acceptable donations attached to the box in Plymouth Hall. Should you wish to donate items, not on the list, please see John Svinth about the possibility of gifting them to other local nonprofits that serve those in need.

Our Blood Drive on October 21st collected 23 donations! Plymouth Hall was again the scene of lifesaving giving as Vitalant staff collected the precious gift of blood. Donations are in critical need and one pint donation can save up to three lives, including children and adults experiencing traumatic injuries and those needing blood for ongoing medical procedures. Our blood drives occur quarterly and in partnership with St. James Church. Our next blood drive is planned for Saturday, January 20, 2024.

Our Christmas Season Missions are approaching! Please watch for more information about the following opportunities to help make the Christmas season merry for those in need: Christmas donations for our Zozu Project boys to provide a modest holiday gift for Daniel and Kizito, our sponsored nine-year-olds in Uganda. The Heifer Project that sends crops and livestock to farmers in developing countries to help themselves and pay it forward. The Toy Bank collects monetary donations or new, unwrapped toys for infants-12 years in a collection box in Plymouth Hall. Bell ringing for the Salvation Army Red Kettle will occur in December. The Christmas Fund offering will be taken December 17 to support retired and active employees of the UCC who have financial need.




