PASTOR'S LETTER

REV. WENDY HOLLAND



"No, this is the kind of fasting I want: Free those who are wrongly imprisoned; lighten the burden of those who work for you. Let the oppressed go free, and remove the chains that bind people. Share your food with the hungry, and give shelter to the homeless. Give clothes to those who need them, and do not hide from relatives who need your help.

"Then your salvation will come like the dawn, and your wounds will quickly heal. Your godliness will lead you forward, and the glory of the Lord will protect you from behind. Then when you call, the Lord will answer. 'Yes, I am here,' he will quickly reply.

~ Isaiah 58:6-9 (NLT) ~

Jesus spent a lot of time encouraging the people around him to see each other in difficult circumstances. It's a theme often referenced in sermons (both mine and others') and this same mandate shows up in various parts of the Bible, especially creating a contrast between how humans show up-or not-for each other. And it's a reminder how God expects us to live: with faithfulness, humility, commitment to God's commands, and compassion.

We do this in a lot of different ways, because each of us is differently equipped. But what we can all agree on is that when we're listening and watching for wisdom and guidance from the Holy Spirit, and we do whatever it is God's asking us to, it usually requires some type of sacrifice on our part . . . and it's a significant blessing to those who need what we have to offer.

Affirmation that we're doing the right thing doesn't usually come with fanfare. We might hear minimal appreciation. Sometimes the people we're helping are too tired to do anything except receive. And sometimes we're challenged, because giving-in all of its forms—is work.

As we move into November's annual Pledge Drive, please prayerfully consider how God wants you contributing to the work of Plymouth Church: financially of course, because this is how we create our budget for the year ahead and determine what we can accomplish as a Christian community; but also of your time and talents. Participating in music, providing fellowship or flowers, serving on a board or committee, feeding the unhoused, visiting and calling those who need extra encouragement, and serving as a greeter or liturgist, are just a few of the ways to genuinely be a blessing.


