"The essence of life is to communicate love." "Be careful who you hate. It could be someone you love." "Love Is Louder." "Do No Harm." My day was punctuated by these thought-provoking phrases that just kept popping up.

We expect to find sentiments like these in a devotional study, or more modern paraphrases of the Bible. But how do we respond when we find them out in the world? In my case these came from the label of a teabag, a couple of t-shirts, and a bumper sticker.

The others also came at just the right time, reminding me that we *constantly* have the opportunity to counter the more negative dynamics around us with words and actions that foster trust and build relationships instead of tearing down those who (maybe justifiably) tick us off. Even as | write this, situations come to mind where | could be more about others, and less about my own rights.

As you go about your day, watch for words and examples that motivate you towards showing the mercy and goodness of Jesus. We could *all* use some love.

Hello Plymouth youth and families, and happy September! I hope you are all having a wonderful start to your month, and are looking forward to the exciting days ahead.

To kick off our events this month, our monthly Date Night will be Friday, September 15th from 5:30-8:30PM at Plymouth's Youth House! Youth of all ages are invited to join us for a night of themed crafts, fun games, good snacks, and time with church peers. Youth are also welcome to bring along a friend! Thank you to Jennie Doherty for providing the food for August's Date Night! Parents, if you are available this coming month to provide food for the kids or serve as parent volunteer for the three-hour event, please let me know. It's parent involvement that makes our youth events possible, so thank you so much in advance!

Date Night will be followed by an overnight for our Youth Group, which is 6th grade and up. We will be staying overnight in the Youth House to play games, eat lots of snacks, and spend time connecting with friends. Just don't forget a blanket and pillow! Going forward, our youth band AND Bible study will meet every Wednesday from 6:30-8:30PM at the Youth House, starting in October. 

These gifts are greatly appreciated for helping the unsheltered.

Neighbors in Need Special Mission Offering

The Neighbors in Need offering supports the UCC's ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States, and will be taken on **World Communion Sunday, October 1**st. Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund a wide array of local and national justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. Working with members of the UCC Justice and Peace Action Network (a network of thousands of UCC justice and peace advocates), Justice and Witness continues its strong policy advocacy work on issues such as the federal budget, voting rights, immigration, health care, hate crimes, civil liberties, and environmental justice.

One-third of the offering supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Historically, forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin, and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM, which is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S.


