I'm notorious in my family for leaving tabs open on my computer. Honestly, it could probably be described as "digital hoarding." The Internet is filled with important information, and ministry ideas, and sermon topics, and advice we can share with loved ones. And even if I don't immediately get to whatever I'm finding useful, I want to be able to access it in the future . . . Which is exactly how I justify it when I'm being berated for my [currently 64] open tabs.

One that's been open the longest is a UCC editorial from January, entitled "Preaching an 'Election Sermon' Is Urgently Needed." And just recently one of my favorite podcasters began a series on "Preaching In a Partisan Age," where he's interviewing a variety of Christian leaders on the importance of maintaining unity in spite of differences, and making sure we're prioritizing Jesus in the midst of navigating an election year.

These resources aren't outliers. Denominational and Christian leaders representing a spectrum of views are increasingly putting out a similar call. Where in the past common wisdom called us to avoid controversial topics at all costs, we now live in an age where we're bombarded with information and opinions, and not talking about things that have such an impact on our lives and our society is simply poor stewardship—and even irresponsible.

So we have stopped evaluating others from a human point of view. At one time we thought of Christ merely from a human point of view. How differently we know him now! This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun! And all of this is a gift from God, who brought us back to himself through Christ. And God has given us this task of reconciling people to him. ~ 2 Corinthians 5:16-18 (NLT) ~

Here's the thing: Imperfect people create imperfect systems As much as we want to get it right, and represent God, and care for others, if we aren't keeping Christ at the center of whatever our ideology, we risk getting it wrong. And no political platform corners the market on how we're supposed to live as Christ-followers.

So in the weeks to come we're going to look at how Jesus dealt with the extremely-divided culture he was born into, how he taught his disciples to regard each other, and how to navigate the issues that created rifts among them.

Whether we vote right, left, center, or not at all, our objective should always be to live out the goodness of God that we find in Christ. And our prayers for guidance and unity (and wisdom for me as I preach) couldn't come at a more crucial time.


